**Throughout these recent challenging times we have continued planning for a better and brighter future for our area and for our community.**

This coming year we break ground on a once in a generation infrastructure project, we work towards ambitious net-zero emissions

targets, and we continue to invest in our community's town centres, parks and recreational spaces.

Residents will now notice the iconic stands of Concord Oval coming down. Following extensive planning and community consultation, it's time to get started on the Redevelopment of Concord Oval – to open the gates to this historic space in 2021 and to give our residents access to not only world class recreation facilities, but also more open green community space.

Our 2020-21 works program features funding for beloved local town centres including a new piazza at Jellicoe Street in Concord, public domain design for Victoria Road in Drummoyne, and further streetscape improvements for Great North Road in Five Dock.

Local sporting enthusiasts will reap the benefit of over \$34 million funding over 2020-21 into local parks and recreation facilities.

With these and other major projects breaking ground across our area in the next 12 months, residents can rest assured that we will also be busy taking care of our core Council business.

Through the last months as we have dealt with the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, I have been so proud of the work our staff has done to keep the area safe, clean and to keep Council business going whilst dealing with both the professional and personal challenges the lockdown presented.

### GREAT NORTH ROAD MAIN STREET UPGRADES

This year we continue significant streetscape upgrades in Five Dock as we begin stage two of the Great North Road revitalisation project from Queens Road to Henry Street.

### PLANTING 2,500 NEW TREES

We are growing the City of Canada Bay's tree canopy to 25 per cent by 2040 and this year we plan to plant 2,500 new trees. We recently asked residents to nominate streets and provide feedback to help us keep our streets cooler and add charm to our neighbourhoods. Increasing our urban canopy improves sustainability by removing carbon, providing habitat for wildlife, and filtering stormwater and air pollution.
