 - c. When will the NSW Government announce the location, funding, delivery timetable and operating plan for the long-promised Rhodes ferry wharf and ferry service to the Rhodes Peninsula?
 - d. When will Rhodes Train Station receive the NSW Government investment needed to support the growth being approved around it including accessibility and passenger safety.
 - e. What transport modelling, validation and infrastructure capacity assessments have been undertaken to demonstrate that the road, public transport and active transport networks can accommodate this cumulative growth, and what thresholds have been identified beyond which further dwelling increases cannot be supported without major infrastructure investment?
 - f. When will the NSW Government release key data underlying its projections for school places, T9 and Metro passengers and capacity.

Share information with residents through its communications channels highlighting the scale of the housing and population growth being directed into the City of Canada Bay, the infrastructure burden this places on our community, and the need for greater NSW Government investment in schools, transport, roads, open space and community services.
3. Officers develop and maintain a dedicated webpage, including a dynamic map, that identifies major development proposals and State-led planning processes across the City of Canada Bay, is regularly updated as new proposals emerge, and provides residents with direct information about how to make submissions through the relevant NSW Government consultation portal. Where publicly available, details of associated infrastructure commitments, the responsible government agency, funding status and anticipated delivery timeframe should also be shown.
