This year we will be upgrading existing foreshore paths to improve safety, amenity, and connectivity, including at Hen and Chicken Bay east in Abbotsford and Deakin Street in Concord. We will also be renewing the seawall at Wangal Reserve in Mortlake.



MAINTAINING OUR LOCAL ROADS AND FOOTPATHS

We continue to work hard on our core services for the community and this year we are investing \$15.1 million on our local roads and footpaths. Planned works include renewing and resurfacing roads across the City, improving local footpaths, gutters, and cycleways, and implementing a pedestrian crossing safety improvement program.
