Guidelines

- Students in Year 5 to Year 9 can participate in the project
- The creative project will run from April to December 2014.
- Choose a serviceman or servicewoman from the list of local servicemen and women.
- Groups may have a maximum of 3 people
- Video clips will cover all four of the following aspects:
 - Summary of person's life
 - How they are connected to the City of Canada Bay area
 - Role they played during WW1
 - How they will be remembered
- Minimum of two of the following media will be used:
 - Music
 - Animation
 - Still photos
 - Original Video
 - Spoken Word

Step by step guide

<p>Step 1: Form your group</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Form your group and choose your person to research from list provided. • Assign tasks to your team drawing on your group's skills.
<p>Step 2: Collecting information</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Using the resource guide locate as much information as possible on your person. • Use multiple sources and remember to use images of documents and photos • To choose another service person please contact Council's Local Studies Librarian, on 9911 6317 or Local.Studies@canadabay.nsw.gov.au, or your teacher to confirm eligibility • Remember the four key areas the video needs to cover: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Summary of person's life 2. Explain person's connection to the City of Canada Bay area 3. Role they played during WWI 4. What they will be remembered for
<p>Step 3: Planning your video</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Video length: between 30 to 60 seconds • Storyboard: outline everything you want to cover in your short clip. • Begin to digitise images to be used. • Write text to be used to communicate information in the video – either using a voice over or text on screen. • Create voice overs by recording the spoken word. • You may like to include some additional images of where the person lived or worked.
<p>Step 4: Creating the video</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use <i>iMovie</i> to create your film using material collected. • You could also use <i>Garageband</i> to create an original piece of music for a soundtrack.
<p>Step 5: Finishing off video</p>	<p>Add credits to the end of your video and submit. Include in your credits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Names of members of the group • Your school name • Main research sources used
