MOTION

That Council acknowledge the life and legacy of Jack Nolan OAM and his contribution to the City of Canada Bay.

BACKGROUND

It is with great sadness that I advise Council of the passing of Jack Nolan OAM.

Jack was a constant and steadfast presence in the City of Canada Bay. He will be remembered as a tireless advocate for access, inclusion and dignity for people with disability in our community.

Jack's service was formally recognised when he was awarded the 2004 Citizen of the Year Award — a fitting acknowledgement of the time, care and conviction he brought to his advocacy.

Jack was one of the founding members of the former Disability Advisory Committee and attended its inaugural meeting in Drummoyne in April 1981. From that point forward, he remained actively involved, becoming instrumental in shaping many of the community access initiatives that followed. His contribution helped embed accessibility as a practical priority in Council's work.

In 2022, he was appointed an Honorary Lifetime Member of the Access and Inclusion Committee in recognition of his remarkable 40 years of service. Throughout that time, he worked steadily and often quietly behind the scenes to ensure that our public spaces, facilities and decision-making processes reflected the needs of all members of our community.

The more inclusive community we continue to build today stands as part of his legacy.

I ask Councillors to join me in acknowledging Jack for the significant impact he had on our local community. He will be greatly missed, and we honour his memory with gratitude and respect.
