**Improvement works notification – Dunlop Reserve playground, Drummoyne**

We recently opened a new playground at Salton Reserve, a key part of the Salton and Dunlop Reserves Master Plan. The playground provides a fun space for children, while enjoying the sensory benefits of the natural surrounds.

Continuing the \$370,000 upgrades identified in the master plan, I am pleased to announce that we are ready to commence on Stage One of the Dunlop Reserve works.

These works will be undertaken in three stages as follows:

**Stage One:** Removal of the existing playground at Dunlop Reserve

**Stage Two:** Seawall restoration works

**Stage Three:** Landscaping and beautification works


The Stage One playground removal works are scheduled to take place on Saturday, 15 June and should be completed on the day, weather and site conditions permitting. As part of our sustainability efforts, any existing play equipment or fencing in good condition will be reused in future maintenance works.

The hours of work will be between 7am and 5pm. During the work period, access to Dunlop Reserve will be restricted. We will endeavour to minimise disturbance and disruption to traffic and pedestrians.

To ensure optimal growing conditions, landscaping works will commence in early spring. Seawall works are set to start in the coming weeks. You will be notified prior to the commencement of works.
