 - Calling on the NSW Government to take immediate action to permanently clear up inequities and inconsistencies around the accounting treatment of RFS assets by acknowledging that rural firefighting equipment is vested in, under the control of and the property of, the RFS;
 - c. Amending s119 of the Rural Fires Act 1997 so that the effect is to make it clear that RFS assets are not the property of Councils.
- 2. Council writes to the Shadow Treasurer the Hon. Daniel Mookhey MLC, the Shadow Minister for Emergency Services the Hon. Jihad Dib MP, the Shadow Minister for Local Government the Hon. Greg Warren MP, the Greens Spokesperson for Local Government the Hon. Jamie Parker MP and the leaders of the Shooters, Fishers and Farmers, Animal Justice and One



Nation parties The Hon. Robert Borsak MLC, The Hon. Emma Hurst MLC and the Hon. Mark Latham MLC:

- a. Advising Members of City of Canada Bay's position, including providing copies of correspondence to the NSW Government Ministers; and
- b. Seeking Members' commitments to support NSW councils' call to amend the *Rural Fires Act 1997* as set out in correspondence.
- 3. That Council affirms its support to Local Government NSW (LGNSW) and requests LGNSW continue advocating on Council's behalf to get clarification finally from the State Government about the accounting treatment of RFS assets.
