

NATURE STRIP PLANTING POLICY

Date of Adoption: 1 November 2021 Effective Date: 1 November 2021





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1.Scope

This policy and supplementing documents apply to the roads in Canada Bay Local Government Area and provide information to residents about the planning, approval, installation and management of nature strip gardens.

In line with the objectives of this policy, specific locations and situations are excluded from this policy as described in Council's Nature Strip Planting Guidelines.

2.Objectives

The objective of this policy is to provide guidelines and a framework for residents to create, install and maintain a nature strip garden in front of their property, or a laneway garden adjacent to their property.

Considerations

- Consider responsibility in relation to other users including pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists;
- Consider the other functions of the land including garbage collection, stormwater management, utility service corridor, parking, and street trees; promoting and guiding effective management and maintenance of established street gardens; and
- Reduce hazards that may result in injuries and/or damage to property.

3. Policy

This policy and supplementing documents apply to the City of Canada Bay owned nature strips between private property boundaries and Council controlled roads within the City of Canada Bay Local Government Area. It provides information to residents about the planning, approval, installation, and management of nature strip plantings.

Council supports the opportunity for residents to plant and maintain natures strip gardens adjacent to their property in accordance with the requirements of this policy and accompanying guidelines. The policy and guidelines address the necessary considerations required for an approval. Note that nature strip gardens need to be considerate of the streetscape and other road users and should support Council's biodiversity objectives.

This policy does not apply to the activities of Council or contracted land management activities and does not apply to businesses.

This policy will not be applied retrospectively. All existing approved nature strip gardens must continue to adhere to their current formal approvals.

Guidelines

4. Definitions

Nature strip: The nature strip is the Council owned land between the private property boundary and the road. This area may be grassed and/or contain street trees, footpaths, road/parking signs, driveways, street furniture and utility services.

Nature strip garden: Nature strip gardens refer to plantings installed by residents. Residents are required to comply with guidelines to ensure that the garden meets the policy objectives, including the submission of a checklist and photographs to Council after completing the installation of the nature strip garden.
Laneway gardens: Laneway gardens refer to plantings within a laneway between the road edge or kerb and the adjacent fence or boundary. If a resident is considering the installation of a laneway garden, they will need to complete the Nature Strip Planting Application form and submit to Council for approval.
Planter boxes: Planter boxes refer to raised structures, in which plants can be grown. In certain circumstances, planter boxes may be installed by the resident on the nature strip in front of their owned or leased property. These structures can have an impact on road users and therefore require an approval process prior to commencing installation of a planter box.

5. Procedure

The policy permits residents to plant nature strip gardens outside their properties on the condition that they:

- a) Ensure the planned nature strip garden meets the requirements of this policy, the supporting guidelines document, and complies the conditions set out in the appendices.
- b) Complete a Nature Strip Planting Application Form (found as Appendix A), and submit this to Council for approval
- c) Once approved ensure that the garden is installed according to the species listed and design specified on the approved Application Form
- d) Submit to Council photographs of the completed nature strip garden
- e) Continue to maintain the nature strip garden to ensure ongoing compliance with the policy and guidelines

The policy permits residents to install **planter boxes** on the nature strip in certain circumstances, however Council approval is required prior to installation. The process of approval requires residents to:

- a) Ensure the planter box garden meets the requirements of this policy and supporting guidelines document, and complies the conditions set out in the appendices.
- b) Complete a Nature Strip Application Form (found in Appendix A), and submit this to Council for approval



- c) Once approved ensure that the planter box is installed according to the species listed and design specified on the approved Application Form
- d) Submit photographs of the planter box upon completion
- e) Continue to maintain the planter box to ensure ongoing compliance with the policy and guidelines

The policy does not permit the following activities:

- a) Planting on State or Regional roads
- b) Using hard landscaping, raised edges or anything that may cause a trip hazard
- c) Other features that do not comply with the policy and guidelines such as synthetic grass

6. Legislation and supporting documents

The relevant legislation is:

- Roads Act 1993, (NSW)
- Local Government Act 1993 (NSW)

Council issues approval to plant on the nature strip through Section 138 Roads Act, 1993 and Section 68 Local Government Act, 1993. The Roads Act decrees Council as the owners of all public roads in their local government area, other than freeways and Crown roads. Nature strips are located within and form part of the road reserve. The Local Government Act Section 68, specifies the range of activities where approvals are required from the local council. This includes approval for any changes to the public nature strip.

Further information on nature strip gardens and planter boxes, including the recommended plantings list, can be found within the *Nature Strip Planting Policy Guidelines*. Available on Council's website and at the Customer Service Centre.

7.Review

This policy will be reviewed in 12 months, following trial of planter boxes. Subsequent review to occur in 3 years.

8. Responsibility

The Director of Community and Environmental Planning is responsible for the overall management of this Policy.




