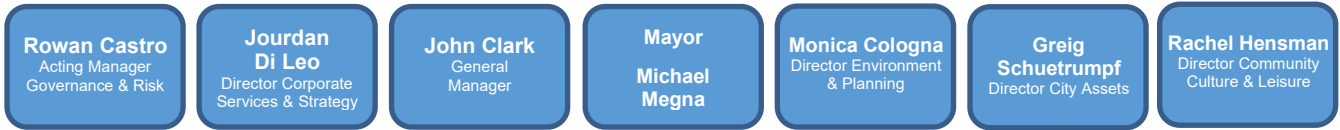

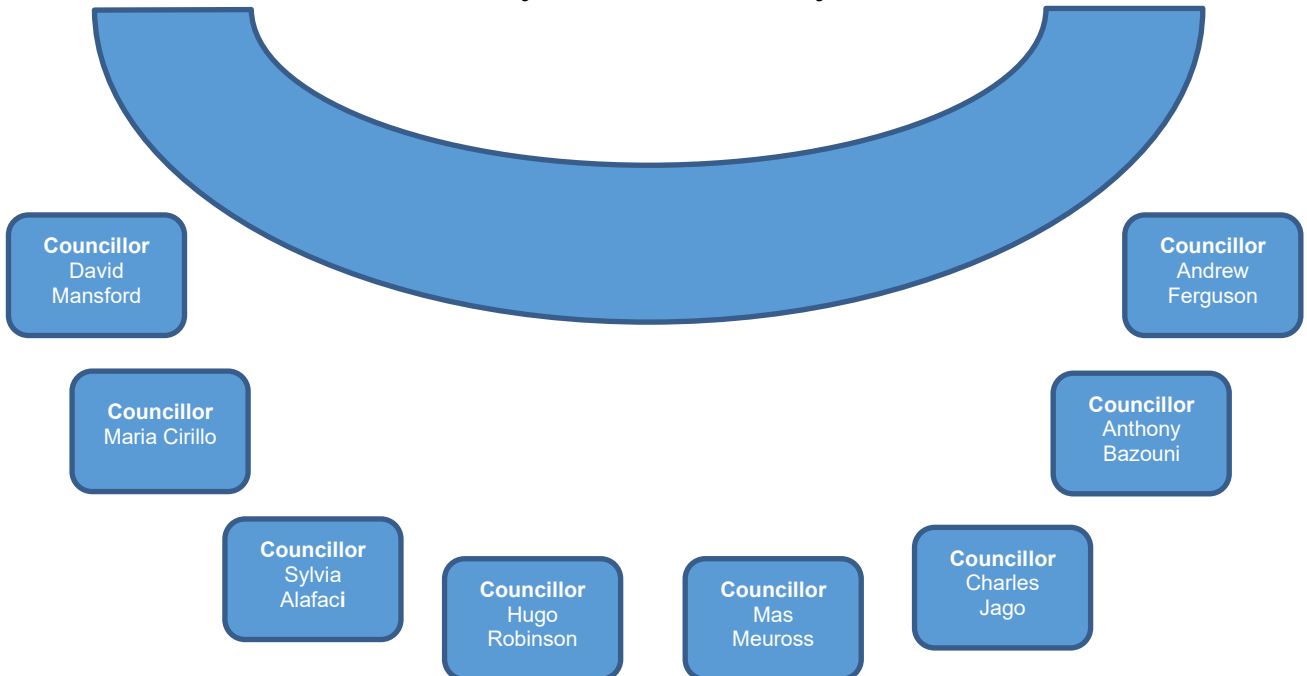

BACKGROUND

I would like to acknowledge and congratulate City of Canada Bay staff members Matthew Balane and Niamh McGuckian on receiving the 2026 Vision Super Environment, Infrastructure and Recreation Local Hero Award presented on 14 May 2026.

This prestigious award recognises local government employees who go above and beyond in service to their communities, demonstrating exceptional care, professionalism and commitment to public service.

Matthew and Niamh were recognised for their compassionate and collaborative response to a complex community matter involving an elderly and vulnerable resident.
