

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

MOTION

That Deputy Mayor Joseph Cordaro meet with Papua New Guinea Minister for Tourism, Arts and Culture, The Hon Isi Leonard, and the Governor of the National Capital District Commission, The Hon Powes Parkop at the Kokoda Track Memorial Walkway and sign the attached Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of Council.

BACKGROUND

The City of Canada Bay has previously been party to two Memorandums of Understanding (MOU) between our organisation and the Papua New Guinean (PNG) Government which recognise the significant connection between Australia, and specifically our local area, and the sacrifices of Papua New Guinean nationals during the Kokoda conflict in World War Two.

Each MOU has endeavoured to promote tourism to PNG and strengthen the links between our local area and our close neighbour, a connection that is of particular significance due to the location of the Kokoda Track Memorial Walkway in our LGA.

As our area grows, it is vital that new residents are able to understand the important connection we have with PNG and to learn about the sacrifices of both our ANZAC soldiers in the Kokoda campaign, but also those of the Fuzzy Wuzzy Angels who supported and fought alongside our soldiers.

An opportunity has arisen to continue the spirit of these previous MOUs.

The Papua New Guinea Minister for Tourism, Arts and Culture, The Hon Isi Leonard, and the Governor of the National Capital District Commission, The Hon Powes Parkop are visiting Sydney on Monday 11 December.

At a planned visit to the Kokoda Track Memorial Walkway, we have the opportunity to sign a renewed MOU which recognises the long history and partnership between the City of Canada Bay and Papua New Guinea and furthers the mutual promotion of goodwill and understanding and the development of education, tourism, health, sporting and cultural initiatives and exchanges.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

The City of Canada Bay, Sydney, Australia and the Papua New Guinea Tourism Authority hereby formally confirm their affiliation with the Kokoda Trail, acknowledging the long history and partnership between our organisations.

The citizens of both areas will endeavour to promote goodwill and understanding and develop education, tourism, health, sporting and cultural initiatives and exchanges for mutual prosperity.

It is our firm belief that the affiliation between Canada Bay and the Tourism Promotion Authority will contribute towards strengthening the friendship between Australia and Papua New Guinea. It recognises the strong bond that was forged between our peoples during the Kokoda Campaign of 1942. It acknowledges the Kokoda Trail as part of the Australian dreaming, a sacred site.

It associates the history of Concord General Repatriation Hospital, the Kokoda Track Memorial Walkway, the Ralph Honner Kokoda Education Centre in Concord, and the "Rusty Priest AM Kokoda Scholarship" with the Kokoda Trail in Papua New Guinea.

To proclaim this auspicious relationship the Mayor of the City of Canada Bay, Sydney and the Minister for Tourism Arts and Culture in Papua New Guinea, on behalf of their respective communities, affix their signatures to this declaration, signed at the Kokoda Track Memorial Walkway on the 3rd day of November 2023.
